On a sad note, while Dehlia was laid up in hospital, I attended the funeral of Jim Harding. Jim was well known and loved around SEQ country music circles; in fact he performed as our guest artist at the very successful Breast Cancer Social fundraiser in February 2012. Jim was one of the first friends Dehlia and I made after arriving in Queensland. Before moving to the Redlands, we would occasionally travel to Pioneer Village Country Music Club where we first met Jim, his wife Lois, Reg & Noreen Benedick, and Ian Scott. In recent years Jim, along with the late Ian Scott, was instrumental in rejuvenating the Peninsular Country Music Club, overseeing it's relocation from the backyard of a house to the current location at John Naumann Hall, Deception Bay. He was always very open about overcoming his battle with alcohol which he credited to the love of his wife Lois; unfortunately this time fate presented Jim with a battle he couldn't overcome. The service, which was held at the Samford Hall, was very well attended and was a fitting tribute to the big man. Rest in peace Jim.



INFORMATION FOR WALK UP ARTISTS

All walk-up artists should report to the MC as soon as possible after arriving. The Social's Program Committee organise the evening's program (i.e. the time in which you appear on stage) from the list of names provided to them by the MC. If you arrive after 5pm please immediately report to the MC. The Social's Program Committee will do their best to slot you into the program, but with limited time available it is not always possible to accommodate everyone.

Please refer to the white board (left of the stage) which will display the order in which walk-up artists appear.

Each artist may perform two songs, with no encores, three songs for duets, or a total of 15 minutes for bands. Please advise the stage hands if you require backing. Chord charts for backing musicians are always helpful and preferable.

There is a room behind stage for your preparation. You must be report to the stage hands and be ready and waiting back stage at least 10 minutes before your performance. Please ensure instruments are tuned before going on stage.





WITH THANKS
