At 47 years of age Tony is enjoying entertaining and music more than ever. 2024 will be Tony's 29th anniversary of being in the music industry and during these past 19 years he has won a string of awards for his entertaining vocals and musicianship including taking out the Male Vocal category in the Christchurch Country Music Awards in New Zealand.

Born and raised in the city of Brisbane, Tony has always been a country boy at heart and furthermore grew up listening to country music and old rock 'n roll. At the age of 13 Tony took up piano lessons and has never looked back since. He played for his own enjoyment at home until being introduced to country music clubs on Brisbane's north at the age of 18. It was at this

time Tony began backing other artists and becoming the resident piano player for other entertainers.


Tony has always had a love for the sound of pedal steel guitar and at the age of 24 purchased his first pedal steel guitar from Texas in the United States. The sight and sound of a pedal steel guitar never fails to draw attention as they are not too many steel guitars still circulating in Australia. Now an accomplished piano and pedal steel player, Tony is a versatile musician who combines dynamic vocals to capture and entertain with passion and polish.

His repertoire includes songs from the Hank Williams and Jerry Lee Lewis eras to the modern-day Adam Brand, Lee Kernaghan, Alan Jackson and George Strait <u>and everything</u>

in between. Tony also enjoys performing rock 'n roll classics and easy listening music and has been enjoying working alongside renowned entertainer John McSweeney, 11 Times Golden Guitar Finalist Graham Rodger and New Zealand Golden Guitar winner Noel Parlane. Tony has also worked with many well-known country music entertainers. In recent years Tony has performed at festivals in all states of Australia including the Gympie Muster, Tamworth and for the last three years at the Western Australian Country Music Awards.

In addition to his own music career, Tony also supports and assists many other Performers as a backing musician and through session work. He also enjoys donating his services for charities to assist in fundraising endeavours. He also organizes fundraising events for charities from time to time. Away from the stage, Tony manages other artists. As previously mentioned, Tony is versatile and this is also reflected by the way he can adapt to working as a solo act, duo or with a full band.

Tony released his album in 2010 "Nashville Dream" which was produced in Nashville.
